

Interaction with Today's Message Permission to Come Aboard Mark 6:45-56

Introduction: Following the miracle of the Feeding of the 5000, Jesus remains in the hills of Bethsaida to pray, while He instructs His disciples to sail southwest toward Magdala. Part way through the voyage, the disciples encounter a storm and Jesus comes to their rescue, walking on the sea. We need to remember: He is willing and able to do the same for us.

Questions for Exploring:

- 1) Describe the setting at the beginning of our Scripture passage for this morning. Where was Jesus? What was He doing? Where were the disciple's? What were they experiencing?
- 2) What connects Jesus and the disciples when He was at one place and they another?
- 3) Does Jesus care when His followers are "straining at the oars?" How do we know? Explain.
- 4) What do you think Jesus walking on water signifies? What does it tell us about Jesus? about His care for us? about power available for believers?
- 5) When and why is it wise to "fear the Lord?" What can take our fear away?
- 6) What is the significance of Mark's comment regarding the disciples: "for they had not understood about the loaves." What do the "loaves" have to do with their rescue at sea?
- 7) Why did Jesus, walking on water, act as if He was going to pass them (the disciples) by? How does this connect with people being allowed to touch Him? Hint: What is our responsibility when Jesus makes Himself available to us?
- 8) What invitation is the Holy Spirit extending to you through God's Word this morning? How will you respond?
